<u>A SYMBOL OF GOD'S COVENANT AS A RAINBOW</u> from today's first reading, is meant to exist in perpetuity as a constant reminder for future generations. "I have set my bow in the clouds," reads Genesis, "to serve

as a sign of the covenant between me and the earth" (Gn 9:13). The presence of a rainbow after or during a rainstorm is hauntingly poetic and beautiful. In other words, God's constant reminder of his presence on earth is a beautiful snapshot from nature. Simply put, the power of this depiction of the covenant as a rainbow after the flood waters remains in the reader's mind like a painted image. This painting draws the person of faith deeply to reflect over and over again what it all means, which *is* the point: A covenant must be renewed over and over again.

While only a few verses in length, today's passage from the Gospel of Mark provides a completely different picture but oddly similar to Noah's flood. Jesus begins his ministry from ground zero, in the desert landscape, "At once the Spirit drove him into the desert" (Mk 1:12). Completely opposite from the flood waters, but the desert's dryness provides the same sense of vast horizon evoking the question: Where do we go from here? Jesus, like Noah, is not alone, "Tempted by Satan, he was among wild beasts, and the angels ministered to him" (Mk 1:13). In Scripture, the desert is the place where existential realities take

precedence. The desert as metaphor is many things, but foremost it is a place of testing. Lent, too, is place of testing with a specific question: **How is our covenant with God going so far?** – Fr. Victor Cancino, SJ
