GREETINGS FROM YOUR "NEW" PASTOR! Fr. Hightower mentioned this past Sunday, as of March 1, 2024, I have assumed officially the role of pastor for St. Ignatius Mission and our two other missions, St. John Berchmans, Jocko, and Sacred Heart, Arlee. This slight change in organizational structure allows Fr. Hightower to narrow his focus on works in Missoula, while still being available for Sunday masses along with our other Jesuit priests who rotate in throughout the year. This change in status allows me to dive-in deeply and help discern our mission as a Eucharistic people on the Flathead. I am thrilled to live, serve and be here with you all. There are so many needs that require attention, but I trust we will journey forward together.

May 12, Sunday, is Mother's Day and Bishop Vetter will be present to celebrate mass and install me as pastor through a simple ritual. That day there will be **ONLY ONE SUNDAY MASS for all communities at 11:00 AM at St. Ignatius Mission**. There will be a reception to follow organized by our Guild. **May 12th** will be a day to celebrate our parish and recognize how a catholic church is organized by acknowledging the Property and Finance Committee, the Parish Council(s), our parish staff and our Native American community that invited the Jesuits to their homeland in the first place. —Fr. 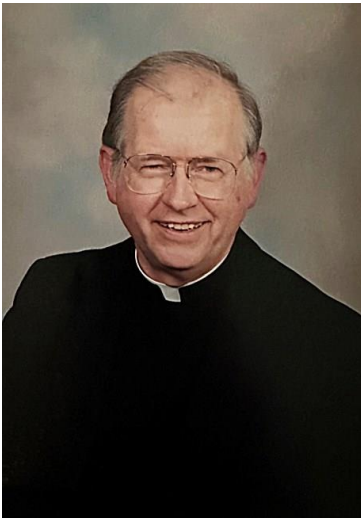

Reverend Thomas Robert Flynn



Thomas Robert Flynn was born on June 2, 1936, in Spokane, Washington, the son of Thomas Flynn and Bernice Colleton. The family moved to Anaconda, Montana, and were members of St. Paul Parish. He graduated from Carroll College and completed seminary studies at the North American College (Pontifical Gregorian University) in Rome. He was ordained a priest for the Diocese of Helena on July 16, 1961. In 1970, he earned a PhD in French Philosophy from Columbia University in New York. He was assigned to the Carroll College Faculty (1962 to 1971, 1976 to 1978), to the Faculty of The Catholic University of America (1971 to 1976), and to the Philosophy Faculty at Emory University in Atlanta, Georgia (1978 to 2020, when he became Emeritus). He gained the reputation of the world's premier authority on French philosopher Jean-Paul Sartre. He published seven books on Sartre and other philosophy topics. In 2006, Carroll College awarded him an honorary degree. While in Atlanta he assisted at St. John Chrysostom Melkite Catholic Church, and celebrated Mass for the Missionaries of Charity at Gift of Grace Hospice in Atlanta. Father Flynn died on the morning of February 29, 2024, at Benton House in Decatur (Atlanta), Georgia.

Lord God, you chose our brother, Tom, to serve your people as a priest and to share the joys and burdens of their lives. Look with mercy on him and give him the reward of his labors, the fullness of life promised to those who preach your holy gospel. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.
